Our vision for wildlife and greenspace is based on a future in which:

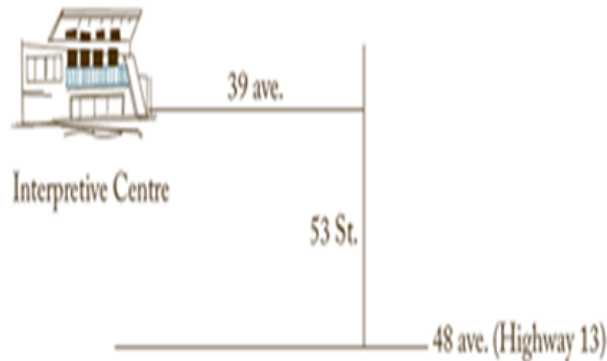
- Wildlife and their habitats flourish in Camrose, supported by effective management

Nature Travel Log Night- May 31st at 7pm. Join in as members of the Camrose Camera Club as they show and tell about nature photos from around the world.

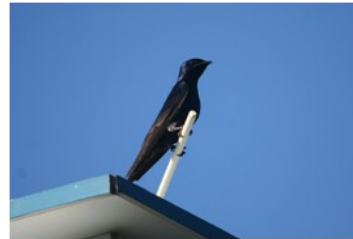
